Adult Protective Services Investment (APSW)

Thinking of moving to your own place?

We are here to help with the planning!

Working with a Planning Facilitator, ABLE2 is offering support for individuals with a development disability who would like to move to their own home.

From now until March 2024, this program is funded by the Ontario Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services. It is available for people who are registered with Developmental Service Ontario — Eastern Region (DSO-ER) office for DS residential services and who have been assessed with low support needs.

You and your Planning Facilitator will create your plan and talk about factors that you will need to consider when living on your own such as finances, housing options, access to services and supports, what resources are available to help you find your new home.

Living independently is exciting and rewarding. This is a great time to talk with your Planning Facilitator about what that may be like for you and how you would like to integrate into the community.

Let's start planning today!

2023 National AccessAbility Week

This year's *National AccessAbility Week* (May 28 — June 3) will be packing an extra punch.

While the government sponsored week celebrates the contributions of Canadians with disabilities, this year's iteration coincides with the June 1st deadline for large federally-regulated employers to publish an accessibility plan. (Employers with 1-0–99 employees have until next year to comply.)

<u>The Accessible Canada Act</u> (implemented in 2019) requires employers to consult people with disabilities as they set up accessibility plans and a feedback mechanism to monitor them. The intent is to create a "barrier-free Canada" by 2040.

The Act is intended to have wide implications for employment, customer service, physical spaces, infrastructure, communication and information systems. Federal government agencies, transportation companies, banks, broadcasters, the armed forces and RCMP must all comply.

One of the first organizations to publish its accessibility plan this year was the <u>Privy Council Office</u>, the department charged with assisting the prime minister to shepherd legislation through Parliament.

Transportation for people with disabilities continues to be challenging. In March, Auditor General Karen Hogan reported that two-thirds of Canadians with disabilities encountered barriers when travelling on trains and planes in 2019-2020. Her report noted that the Canadian Transportation Agency has only four employees to enforce hundreds of rules for 130 transportation providers. Hogan also suggested that VIA Rail and the Canadian Air Transport Security Authority study patterns in customer service data rather than just deal with individual complaints, and remedy the low participation rate of managers and executives in their mandatory accessibility training programs.

Canada's *National AccessAbility Week* was established as part of The Accessible Canada Act and includes an annual congress on disability inclusion. Although details of the 2023 congress were still not available in late April, last year's virtual congress included a career fair and a showcase of innovative projects and products.
